

Hypothetical Payout Profile

The profile to the right illustrates the potential payment on the Securities for a range of hypothetical percentage changes in the closing level of the Underlying from the pricing date to the applicable Observation Date. The profile is based on a hypothetical Call Premium of 7.00% for the first Observation Date, 14.00% for the second Observation Date, 21.00% for the third Observation Date and 28.00% for the final Observation Date (based on the specified minimums for the Call Premiums) and a Threshold Value equal to 90.00% of the Starting Value.

How The Redemption Amount Is Calculated

If the Securities are not automatically called, then on the Maturity Date you will receive a cash payment per Security equal to the Redemption Amount. The Redemption Amount per Security will equal:
